Fish and Lake:

Opening Day of Trout Season is just around the corner!

Saturday April 6th, 8am

Our scheduled stocking dates are Thursday, March 28th, 12pm and Friday, April 26th, 12pm.



This season we have ordered Brook trout to compliment the Rainbow, Brown and Palominos!

Kids Trout Derby will be on March 30th, to coincide with the PA Mentored Youth Trout Fishing Day. The Derby will run from 8 to 11 AM (the kitchen will open at 7am for breakfast). ****Prizes will be awarded****

Eligible Anglers

-  Youth anglers need a Mentored Youth Permit OR a Voluntary Youth Fishing License from the Commission and to be accompanied by a licensed adult angler to participate. With their License OR Permit, they can take a total of two trout (combined species) with a minimum length of 7 inches. Adult anglers are prohibited from possessing trout.
-  Anglers 16 years of age or older are adult anglers and need a valid Pennsylvania Fishing License and a current Trout Permit. To participate on MYTD, anglers over 16 must be accompanied by an eligible holder of a Mentored Youth Fishing Permit OR a Voluntary Youth Fishing License from the Commission.

Guidance for mentors


-  Youth should be capable of fishing on their own, with limited assistance from mentor.
-  Mentor should be fishing within a reasonable distance of actively fishing youth.
-  This day is for mentors and their youth, and not designed for large groups of youth fishing, with minimal adult supervision.

You might also consider arriving on Friday to stay the night at our campground for an unforgettable fishing excursion.

Once the Derby has concluded, the Lake will be closed to fishing until 8 AM, Saturday April 6th (first day of PA Trout Season). All the PA requirements and regulations will be enforced.

Archery

We've just wrapped up our Winter Indoor Archery. Folks enjoyed the comradery and fine tuning their skills. They shot 15 rounds for a total of 45 arrows at 20 yards. Winter Indoor is great to keep yourself in hunting shape. They then slide right into a short season of Indoor Small animal targets This short 4 week season adds a 10 yard target along with the 20 yard. Season starts,3/17, Sundays at 2pm, Mondays at 7pm. You will shoot 12 rounds- 4 arrows per round. Cost is \$20 and there is still time to register at www.sccsfa.org.

Stop the Bleed Training Seminar

SCCSFA is hosting its second Stop the Bleed event on Wednesday, March 20, 2024 at 6pm in the Clubhouse.

Cost is \$15 and is for members and their families only

The Stop the Bleed® campaign was created to “build national resilience by better preparing the public to save lives by raising awareness of basic actions to stop life threatening bleeding.”

As in the first event, Lenny Brown will be our instructor. As in the last session, students will participate in a short lecture and then get some hands-on practical time focusing on wound packing and tourniquet application. Once the course is completed each student will receive a certificate of completion.

Making the Hundred

Congratulations to member, Kevin Umbreit, for his accomplishment in the President's Hundred Rifle Match at Camp Perry in Port Clinton, OH. This match is one of the most prestigious matches of the week. The President's Hundred Tab is awarded to the top 100 competitors. Kevin finished in the top 8% of the 860 competitors in the July 2023 Match. Competitors must fire the matches using one of the three U.S. Military Service Rifles—the M1 Garand, the M14/M1A, or the M16A4/AR15. They may be accurized in a limited manner and utilize either iron sights or a maximum 4.5x scope, but the as-issued exterior dimensions/appearance and caliber must remain standard. The format of the match is simple but does not permit a shooter to take one bad shot: 10 shots fired at 200 yards, standing, in a time limit of 10 minutes; 10 shots fired at 300 yards, dropping to prone from standing, in a time limit of 70 seconds; and 10 shots fired at 600 yards, prone, in a time limit of 10 minutes.
